

Flat Classroom Lesson #6

Objectives: Reflection and Evaluation

- evaluate at least 5 videos from other schools
- enter one nomination for “best student video” on the Wiki
- reflect on the Flat Classroom Experience
- prepare for a Student Summit on Dec. 12

1 Peer Evaluation

1) Use the video evaluation rubric from FCP #5, Criterion A & B, and the Peer Evaluation Worksheet to consider at least 5 videos of your choosing, not from our school. Attach the worksheet to this assignment.

2) **Nominate a video** on the Wiki. Be sure to use the required form. Print out a copy of your nomination and attach it to this worksheet.

2 Reflection

1) **Write a reflection** on your Flat Classroom Project experience.

2) Use the following outline:

a) **Introduction**- what you did: Your group, your topic, your contribution to the wiki, your video, your participation on the ning and the wiki discussion.

b) **Strengths** of the Project, Learning Experiences. Give at least 5 specific examples.

c) **Challenges** of the Project

d) **Recommendations** for improvement, both of the project as a whole and of your participation in it.

e) **Conclusion**. Summarize your experience.

3) **Post** it on the ning. Attach a copy of the posting.

3 Preparation for Student Summit

Summit details:

- The student summit is a chance for you to showcase your work from the Flat Classroom Project
- It is held in the video conferencing room provided by our sponsors, Elluminate
- Each student will have an opportunity to talk for a few minutes about their work and to provide an artifact based on their topic/theme/video

a) **Write** a one page presentation outline.

- a) Your topic and what you learned from studying it.
- b) Your sub-theme and how that related to the work you did.
- c) Your digital story: how you developed your ideas, the communication with your partners and the acquiring of the outsourced video clips.
- d) The use of the Ning and the wiki
- e) Point out strengths and challenges of the project. End with a strength. Attach to this assignment sheet.

b) Prepare a supporting artifact to show on the screen.

The best way to do this is to have an image file ready to bring in. Make sure this is an acceptable size in dimensions and memory. The image may be something from your wiki page, from your video or a collage of influences throughout the project. You may use Comic Life or any program you feel comfortable in. Print out a copy and attach it to this assignment sheet.

c) Be ready to answer questions

Visitors to the summit will want to ask you questions so be prepared to answer truthfully and with confidence.

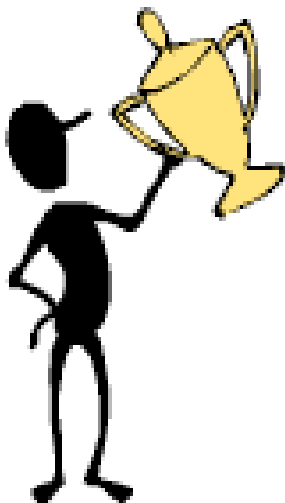
